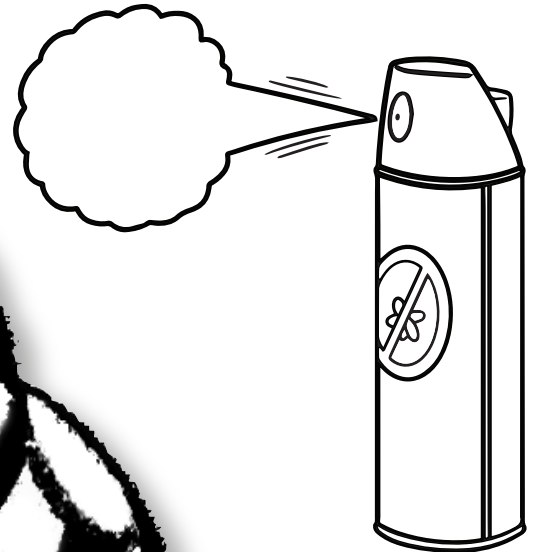

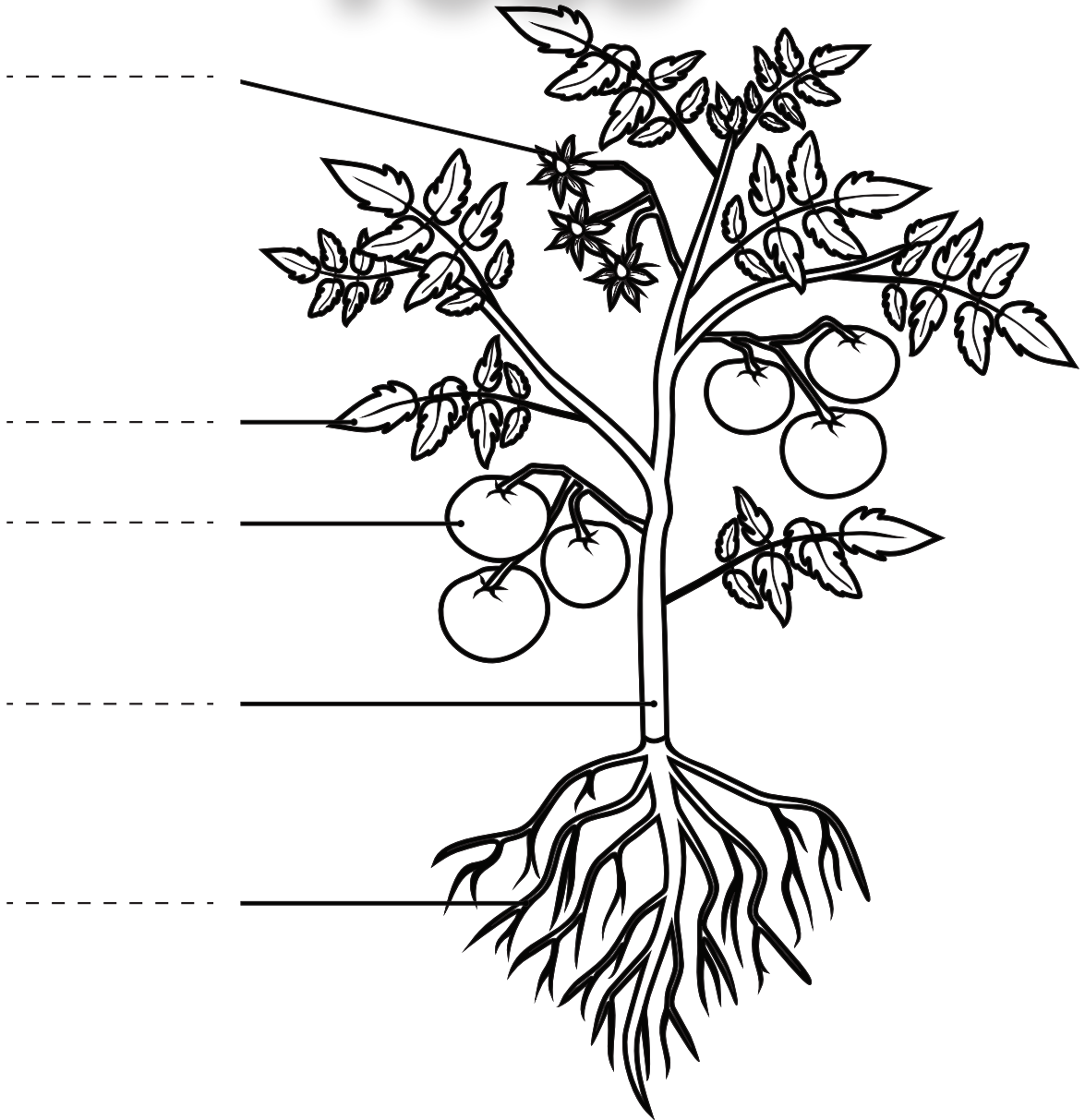

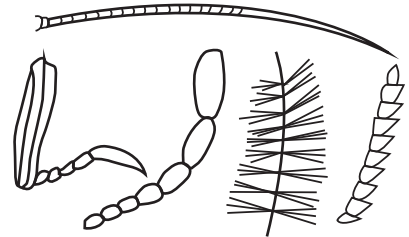
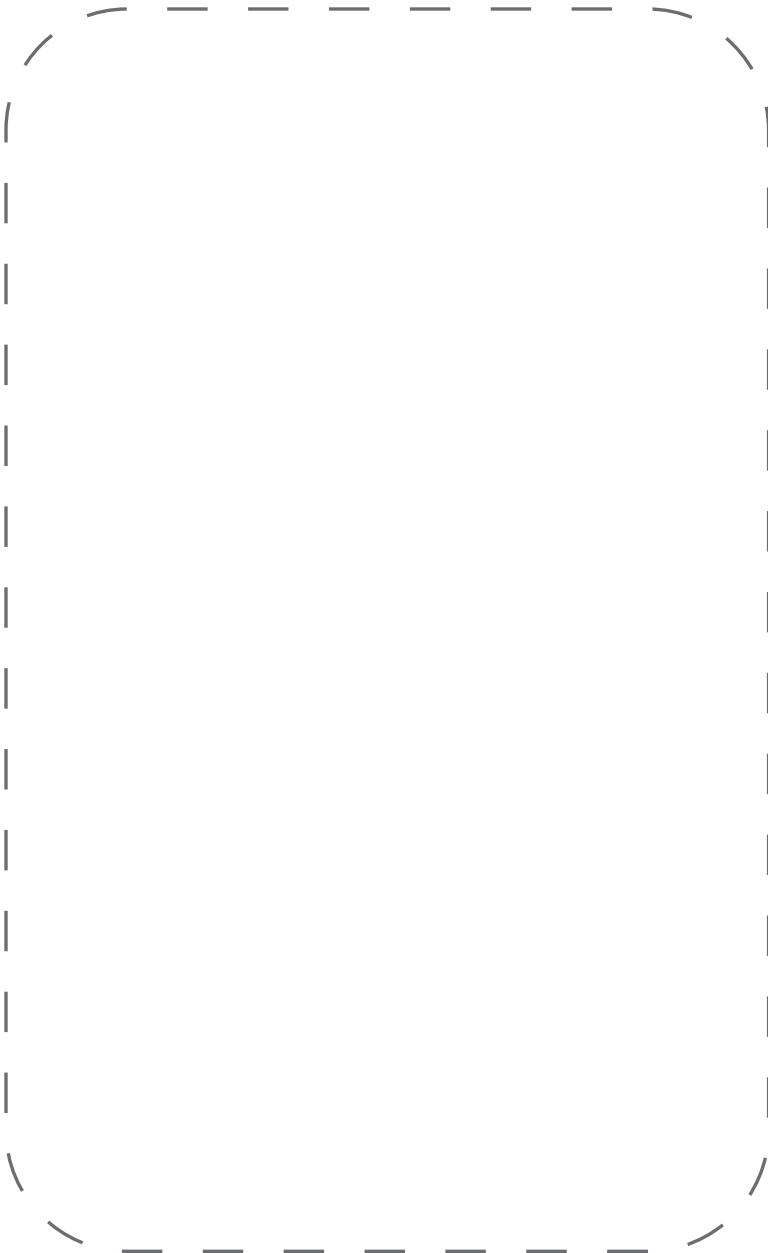
Bees perform a dance to show other bees where to find food.

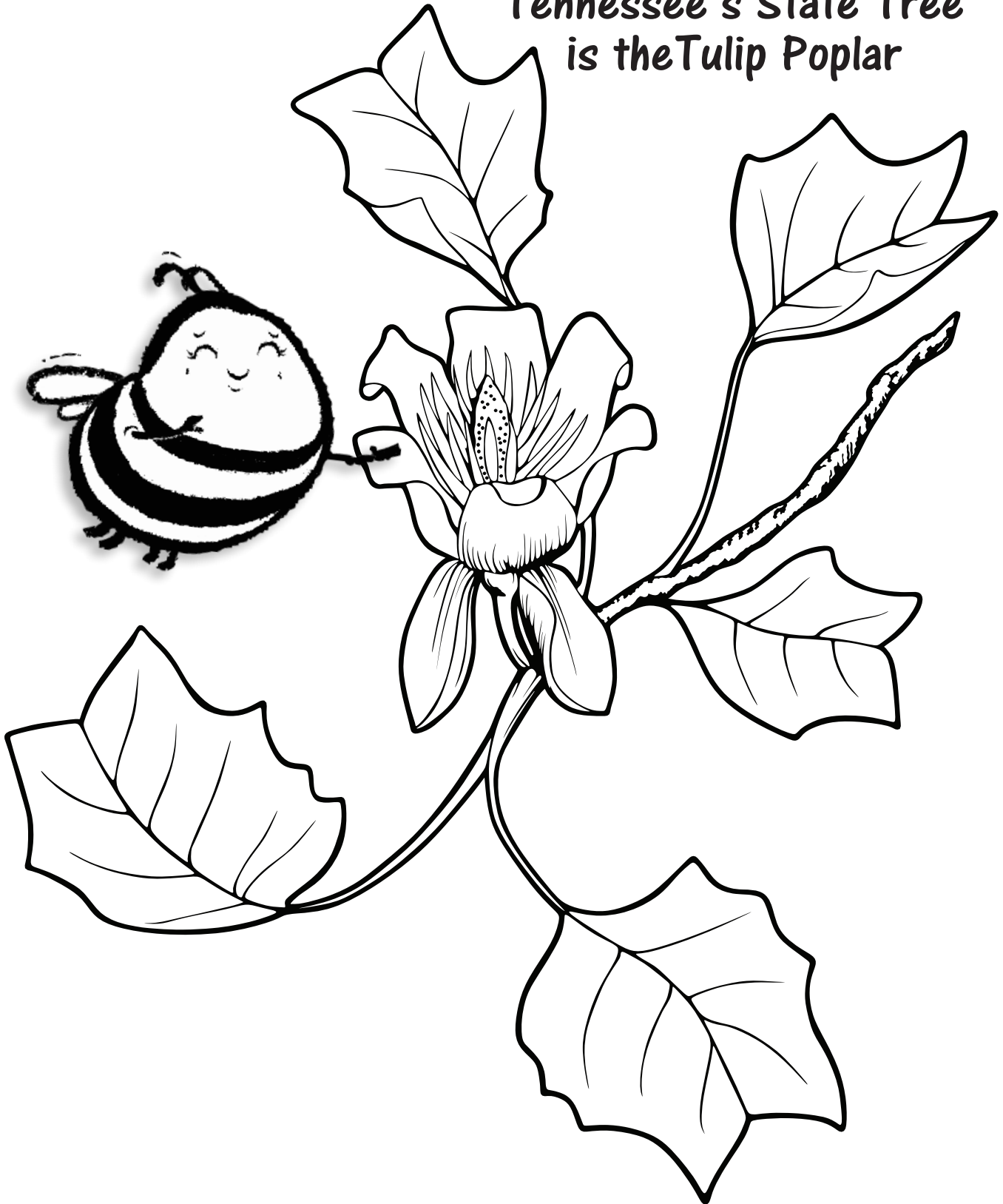
