









Polli the bee lives underground.




Polli needs food, water and shelter.



Circle the things pollinators need to grow.






Label the parts of the flowering plant.

Polli eats pollen from flowers.





Polli's body moves pollen from one part of a flower to another.








Bees perform a dance to show other bees where to find food.





Tulip Poplar trees produce abundant nectar and pollen from its flowers.


Tennessee's State Wildflower is the Purple Coneflower
